

1st place to provide no-cost attorney to tenants facing eviction




Transforming Tenants Rights

Problem & Unmet Need

- Justice delayed. Tenants can't get attorneys even though its their right.
- Opportunity lost. New jobs created by Right to Counsel going unfilled.
- Unfinished Mandate. Legal services groups face difficulty recruiting, hiring & retaining housing attorneys.



Housing Justice Pipeline



- Partnership between law school housing clinics & legal services groups
- Law students receive comprehensive, hands-on training & experience with tenants facing eviction
- Create new generation of driven & passionate housing attorneys
- Fill jobs in expanded market created by the Right to Counsel movement

Hiring

- Increase professional network & opportunities.

Funding to Law Schools

- Create or expand Housing Clinics
- Fund Adjuncts from Legal Services orgs to supervise students
- Litigation funds
- Social media & press



Partnership Grants

Funding to Legal Services

- Fellowships for recent grads
- Paid internships & externships
- Pay stipend to senior attorneys to supervise & mentor law students
- Consult to provide materials and assistance to law students & clinic educators
- Increased pay

Preliminary Survey Findings

42 Law Schools responded to Survey



66% of clinics train students in seminar classes

69% of clinics started in 2017 or later

81% believe better pay for housing jobs is necessary

56% teach classes covering housing justice
