The program is co-sponsored by the Sections on Children and the Law, Clinical Legal Education, and Teaching Methods.

The panel is scheduled to be held during the AALS Annual Meeting in early January 2021 in San Francisco. The goal of the session is to discuss and share our use of in-class exercises and methods of experiential learning in family and juvenile law. Presenters will be asked to share relevant materials in advance of the Annual Meeting.
