Potential topics include but are not limited to: aging and employment related issues, the disparate impact of policies on older adults within the healthcare system, the rights and wages of direct care workers, how law school clinics have/are adapting to helping older individuals especially those impacted by the effects of COVID and other health and/or employment related issues, the impact of technology on access to legal assistance, and overall access to justice for older adults.

We particularly encourage submissions from junior scholars and members of underrepresented groups in legal academia. The Annual Meeting will be held in-person in San Diego, California from January 4th-7th, 2023 (<https://am.aals.org/>) and the theme is *How Law Schools Can Make a Difference*.
