

The AALS Section on **Creditors' and Debtors' Rights** is pleased to announce a "Works-in-Progress" session for the 2023 AALS Annual Meeting in San Diego, California entitled "New Voices in Bankruptcy". This works-in-progress program will give junior scholars in the field of debt, credit and bankruptcy, broadly defined, a chance to showcase their new work and gain exposure in the field. Both consumer-focused and business-focused scholarship is welcome.

FORMAT: Scholars whose papers are selected will provide a brief presentation of their paper with time for Q&A from the audience.

SUBMISSION PROCEDURE: Junior scholars who are interested in participating in the program should send a draft or summary of at least five pages to Professor Ken Ayotte at kayotte@berkeley.edu on or before **Friday, September 9, 2022**. The cover email should state the junior scholar's institution, tenure status, number of years in their current position, and whether the paper has been accepted for publication. The subject line of the email should read: "Submission-New Voices in Bankruptcy."

ELIGIBILITY: Junior scholars at AALS member law schools are eligible to submit papers. "Junior scholars" includes untenured faculty who have been teaching full-time at a law school for ten or fewer years. The Committee will give priority to papers that have not yet been accepted for publication.

Pursuant to AALS rules, faculty at fee-paid non-member law schools, foreign faculty, adjunct and visiting faculty (without a full-time position at an AALS member law school), graduate students, fellows, and non-law school faculty are not eligible to submit. Please note that all presenters at the program are responsible for paying their own annual meeting registration fees and travel expenses.
