New Scholarship on European Law: Works-in-Progress Panel

The AALS Section on European Law is pleased to announce a Call for Papers for its “New Scholarship on European Law” works-in-progress workshop.

The workshop will be held in person, on Wednesday, January 4, 2023, 3 - 4:40 PM. It will immediately follow the European Law Section main panel on “The War in Ukraine and the Future of the European Union” (scheduled from 1 to 2: 40 PM).

Our aim is for the workshop to bring together three or four scholars to present recent work in EU law. While we are inviting submissions from both junior and senior scholars, the selection committee might give preference to junior scholars if more submissions are made than we can accommodate.

Format: Each scholar will have 15 minutes to present their paper. Papers will also be circulated in advance.

Submission procedure: Authors should send an abstract (or longer summary) or draft-in-progress to the Chair of the Section on European Law, Vlad Perju, at [perju@bc.edu](mailto:perju@bc.edu) by Sept 20, 2022. Ideally, submitted papers will be “in progress” as of the time of the Annual Meeting in January 2023 (a paper accepted for publication but still undergoing revision is considered “in progress”). The finished papers should be submitted by mid-December 2022.
