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



#### Who Has Seen Seeing Allred?

- Born in 1941, trailblazing lawyer Gloria Allred grew up in a pre-feminist era.
- Received B.A. (English) at University of Pennsylvania in 1963, when student body was 93% male and only 7% female.
- After graduating from law school in 1975, went on to become one of the most vocal women's rights attorneys in America.




#### Why Use Seeing Allred?

- 1. **DEI:** Addresses numerous real-world examples of fighting for DEI principles in the law, especially women's rights and LGBTQ rights
- 2. ABA Standard 303(b)(3): Implemented in 2022, satisfies the new educational requirement that law schools provide "substantial opportunities to students" for "the development of a professional identity ("PIF")"
- 3. ABA Standard 303(c)(1)-(2): Implemented in 2022, satisfies the new educational requirement for teaching "bias, cross-cultural competency, and racism" in the "first year" and/or "once again before graduation"
- **4. Student Interest**: In 2022, LSAC reported 70% of incoming law students reported "social justice, helping others, or uplifting their community" as a main driver to attend law school
- **5. Educational Engagement**: In combination with reading and writing, students benefit from an additional format for learning

## Satisfies the ABA 303(a)-(c) Lawyer "Values and Obligations" Content

ABA Interpretation 303-5

PIF focuses on "the special obligations lawyers have to their clients and society. The development of professional identity should involve an intentional exploration of the values . . . foundational to successful legal practice."



ABA Interpretation 303-6 as applied to Professional Responsibility (303(a)(1))

"The obligation of lawyers to promote a justice system that provides equal access and eliminates bias, discrimination, and racism in the law should be among the values and responsibilities of the legal profession to which students are introduced."


## How to Use? Clip Background: LGBTQ Rights

- Same-Sex Marriage Ban: For years in the early 2000s, Allred represented client Robin Tyler, who could not get married under the same-sex marriage ban in California.
- Won at CA Supreme Court: Allred and her law partner (Michael Maroko) represented Tyler in a lawsuit ending up at the California Supreme Court, striking down state law prohibiting same-sex marriage as unconstitutional in 2008.



#### How to Use? Clip Background: Women's Rights

- Cosby Allegations: Around 2014, Allred began representing women who accused Bill Cosby of sexual assault and rape.
- SOL: Because the statute of limitations passed for many, there was no traditional legal recourse in CA.
- CA SOL Elimination: Instead, Allred used the media and lobbying to create a public trial, which did achieve some justice through empowerment and legal change such as the elimination of SOL for rape/sexual assault in CA in 2016.





## How The Clip Supports Education about DEI, PIF, Bias, and Social Justice

- 1. How does it support DEI education? Explores LGBTQ rights (same-sex marriage) and sexism/bias in the law (low statute of limitations for sexual assault)
- 2. How does it support PIF and bias education? Shows Allred's dedication in promoting a justice system that provides equal access and eliminates bias in society (LGBTQ rights and women's rights)
- 3. How does it support student interest in social justice? Demonstrates Allred's dedication to help achieve 1) LGBTQ rights for a longtime client, which helped the entire LGBTQ community and 2) reduction in the SOL for sexual assault victims empowering all women

## How To Use The Entire Documentary: Reflection Questions and Discussion Examples

- **1. DEI:** What did you learn about diversity, equity, and inclusion from this documentary?
- 2. Bias: Identify specific examples of bias explored in the documentary. What mechanisms (legal, media, lobbying, etc.) did Allred use to challenge this bias?
- **3. Real-World Cases**: Pick one of Allred's lawsuits mentioned and research the claims. Identify the social justice angles and legal arguments. Was the result just?
- 4. Values/Obligation: How did Allred fulfill the obligation of lawyers to promote a justice system that provides 1) equal access and 2) eliminates bias and discrimination in the law?
- **5. PIF**: How did Allred's personal experience lead to development of her own PIF?
- **6. Client Representation**: What did you think about Allred's innovative style of client representation?
